Village of Lake in the Hills Earns Mark of Distinction, Receives Tree City USA Growth Award from Arbor Day Foundation

Lake in the Hills, IL – The Arbor Day Foundation awarded the Village of Lake in the Hills a Tree City USA Growth Award to honor its commitment to effective urban forest management. A Growth Award is bestowed to a community alongside their Tree City USA recognition for demonstrating environmental improvement and a higher level of tree care.

The Growth Award recognizes major milestones and annual activities in five categories on a point-based system to build sustainable community forestry programs over the long term such as: building a team, measuring trees and forests, planning the work, performing the work, and building the community framework.

The Village has been recognized as a Tree City USA for 21 consecutive years and has previously earned the Growth Award 13 times.

“By recognizing the role of trees as critical infrastructure, Lake in the Hills is helping shape a healthier and more resilient future. We’re proud Lake in the Hills is among the Arbor Day Foundation’s growing network of communities committed to creating a positive impact through trees,” said Michelle Saulnier, Vice President of Programs at the Arbor Day Foundation.

With the additional recognition of a Growth Award, the Village of Lake in the Hills has demonstrated expediency toward building framework for sustainable urban forest management. According to the Arbor Day Foundation, urban tree plantings help reduce energy consumption by up to 25%, which will reduce general energy costs and help with the overall cooling of the Village as well. In addition, members of the community benefit from properly placed trees as they increase property values from 7-20%. Trees also positively affect the local ecosystem by helping to clean water and create animal habitats to encourage biodiversity.
